CTS Courses:

- A typical CTS course is 13 weeks in duration, at a frequency of one class a week.
- Modular courses are intensive courses conducted over 4 full days.
- While most courses have a total of 30 classroom hours, some have a total of 45 classroom hours or 30 classroom hours + practical work amounting to 15 hours.

Course Delivery

- **Onsite:** The course is taught at the CTS campus in Kohuwela or the North Colombo Study Centre.
- **Online:** The course is taught via Zoom and course material is made available on Moodle. You will require a strong internet connection and a digital device.
- **Hybrid:** The course is taught as a combination of onsite and online. Some weeks your class will be held at the CTS campus in Kohuwela, while on other weeks it will be taught online. Your lecturer will inform you of the schedule at the commencement of the course.

Reading Old Testament Narrative

About forty percent of the Old Testament is made up of narrative texts, such as the patriarchal stories, the Exodus and Wilderness experience, and the periods of the Judges and the Kings. Although narratives present themselves as relatively simple, an accurate grasp of their messages require that we read them according to the terms of Hebrew storytelling; tracking characterisation, plot, and setting. In South Asia, as in ancient Israel, narrative has been the mode of transmission for handing down wisdom and instruction. Our cultural affinity with the narrative-genre, supports the preaching and teaching of biblical narrative as a ministry strategy in disciple-making.

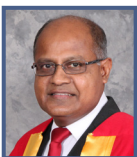
Nathanael Somanathan, BEng, MA, PhD (candidate)

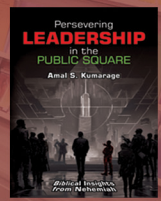
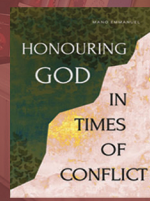
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
